

Water: The City of Glenwood Springs determines when the water will be turned on at the garden. Many factors weigh in on their decision. The date is typically mid-May.

1. Gardeners are responsible for watering their own garden.
2. When not in use, hoses should be kept neatly along the edge of the path or coiled at the spigot.
3. During city water restrictions water only on even days.

Path Maintenance: The care given to the paths is due to the large number of visitors that walk through and enjoy the garden as part of the Wulfsohn Mountain Park complex.

1. Gardeners are responsible for maintaining the paths surrounding their garden.
2. The paths must be kept free of all vegetation, debris, hoses, tools, and anything that may be a tripping hazard.
3. Weed barrier is available in the shed at no cost. Wood chips are generally available to put on the barrier. Please do not use cardboard under the chips. The surface remains slick for quite a while.

Plot Maintenance: The growing space must be regularly cared for, watered, and weeded for the entire season.

1. Plants should be kept within plot perimeter.
2. Sunflowers, hollyhocks, and other invasive plants must not be allowed to go to seed or extend into the paths.
3. Food grown during the season must not be allowed to go to waste. Food not harvested in a timely manner will be gleaned for local food banks.
4. Marijuana and tobacco may NOT be grown at the Community Garden.
5. Gardeners should have their garden cleaned and ready for winter by Nov 1.

Organic Soil, Compost, Fertilizer:

1. Only organic compost, amendments, fertilizers, and *pest management materials* may be used in the garden.

Shed and Tools: The garden offers a fully stocked shed of tools, wheelbarrows, and other items. Individual gardeners may need their own hand tools.

1. Clean all tools before returning them to the shed.
2. Tip debris out of wheelbarrows before parking them.
3. Do not store any personal items in the shed.
4. Do not bring any cast-off items to be stored in the shed unless cleared by your team leader.

Miscellaneous Items:

1. Trash: Pack it in/Pack it out. Do not use the trash receptacle in the parking lot. It is for the hikers, bikers, and dog walkers on Wulfsohn Trail.
2. Solicitation: No gardener may sell a product, fundraise, gather signatures, campaign, proselytize for any cause, issue, or person while in the garden.
3. No camping, (it is in our city lease) you can't live here... though we all want to.
